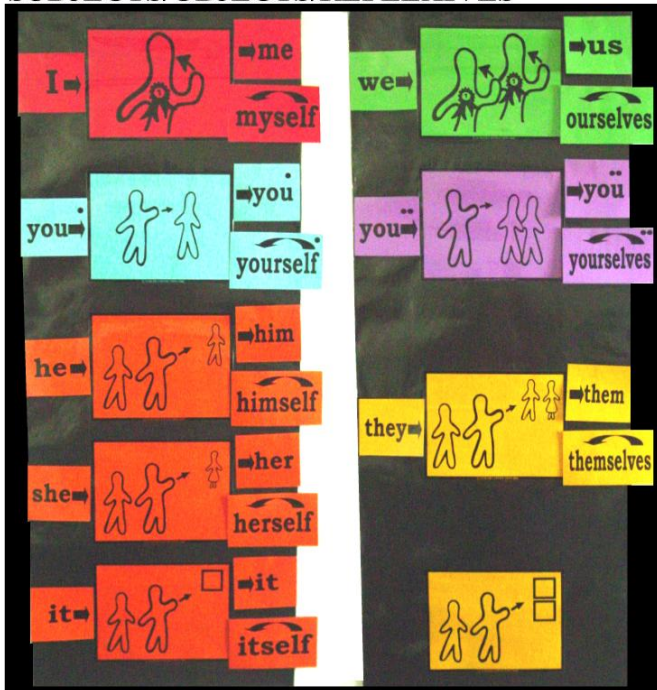


SUBJECTS/OBJECTS/REFLEXIVES

Pronoun visuals symbolize
1st Person, 2nd Person, 3rd Person
Singular and Plural
Pronoun words seen here are

MANIPULATIVES
that are attached to display.

COLOR CODING

says to the learner:

*We use different pronouns
to refer to people or things,
depending on their function
in the sentence.*

Actual Colors:

red blue orange
green purple yellow

SUBJECTS/POSSESSIVE FORMS

CASE SYMBOLS:

SUBJECT →

Arrow after the word
means "doer of action"



→ **OBJECT**

Arrow before the word
means "receiver of action"



REFLEXIVE

Arrow pointing back means
"doer is also receiver"



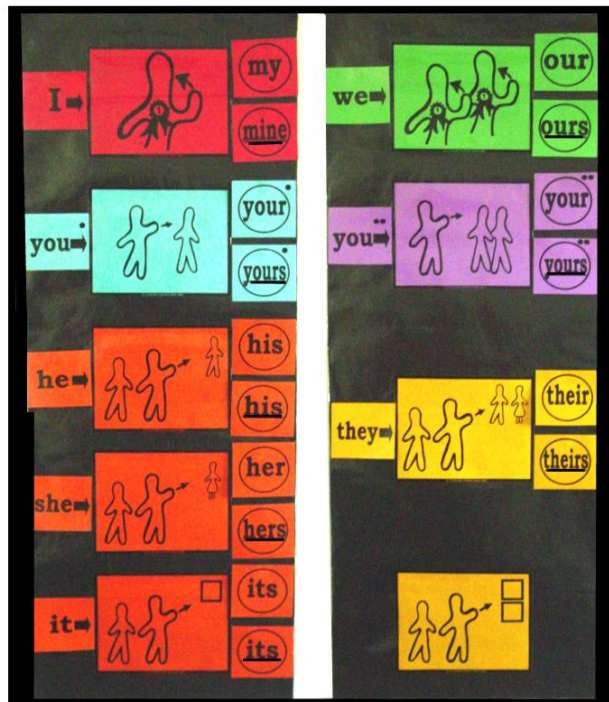
POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

Circle means "ownership"

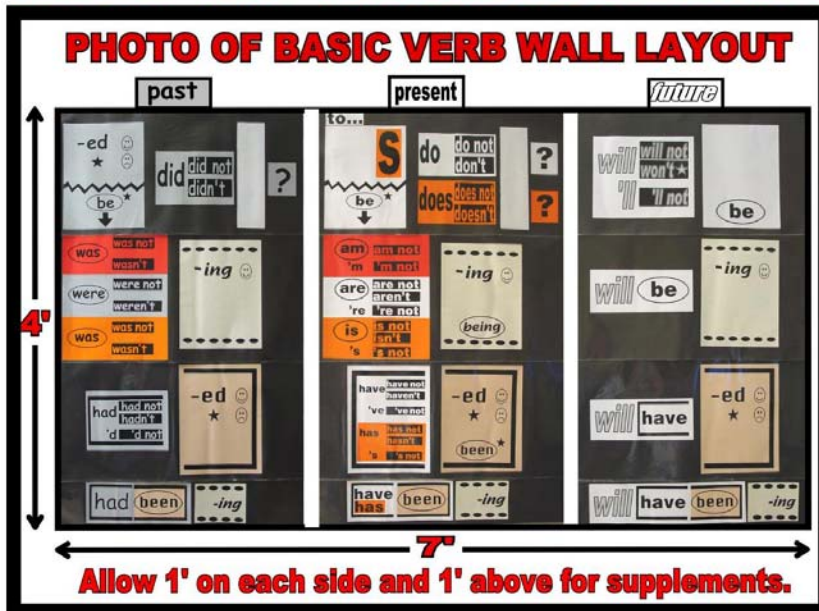


POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

Line means "stand alone"



PLEASE TAKE THE TIME TO OBSERVE THE SYMBOLS.



★ Notice how the PRONOUN COLORS are used to show:

- ➡ -S for he/she/it form
- ➡ irregular forms of BE in past and present
- ➡ forms of helping verbs DO and HAVE

★ Notice how the functions of the 4 verb forms are shown with 4 colors:

- WHITE -base form
- GRAY -simple past
- TAN -past participle
- IVORY -present part.

- ★ Notice how the progressive tenses are marked with dotted lines, meaning "unfinished."
- ★ Notice how the perfect tenses are marked with a rectangle, open on the side that joins with "HAVE" but closed on the other side, meaning "finished" action.

Additional Supplemental sheets deal with MODALS and many other details such as: "used to" "If I were you..." and registers of language.

PLEASE OBSERVE WHAT THESE COLORS AND SYMBOLS TEACH:

The uses of the 4 forms of English verbs are MAPPED on the Verb Wall. (SEE OTHER SIDE.)

Notice the stars and other symbols that visualize the following verbalized explanations.

VERBS may be divided into categories:

1	2	3	4	5	6
walk	teach	eat	put	run	prove
walked	taught*	ate *	put *	ran *	proved
walked	taught*	eaten**	put *	run *	proved proven*
walking	teaching	eating	putting	running	proving

- 1- Regular: simple past and past participle end in -ED
- 2- Mutants: simple past and past participle are the same.
- 3- Mega-Mutants: simple past and past participle are different.
- 4- Clones: simple past and past participle are the same as the white base form.
- 5- Mutant-Clones: past or past participle is the same as the white base form.
- 6- Transformers: simple past is regular; past participle is becoming regular, but older form is still accepted, especially to describe. (*It is a proven fact.*)

**The English Verb Wall kit provides 104 sample verbs—
8 Regular and 96 Irregular or Troublesome in some way.**

Verb forms are printed on the appropriate color, 8 forms to an (8 1/2 X 11) sheet. They are cut and sorted to make these manipulatives which are placed in the appropriate slot on the Verb Wall. As the need to teach a verb comes up naturally in a lesson, those forms are pulled and placed in their positions.
